2025 MULE DAYS FAQs

Is there a charge to walk around the fairgrounds to shop & see exhibits? No. There is no fee to enter the fairgrounds or for parking. You only need to buy tickets for Friday, Saturday & Sunday arena shows, the Thursday night concert and Saturday night dance.

Where can I get an event schedule? Official Mule Days Souvenir Programs are available at the fairground and many local merchants (\$7 each). Very detailed schedules are included in the program (contestant names, classes, etc.). Program sales support local youth groups. General event schedule is attached.

How and where can I purchase Mule Days event tickets? Online at <u>www.muledays.org</u>. Tickets will be available at the arena ticket office (enter on Sierra Street). Single arena show tickets are only \$20 for general admission.

When & where is the parade? Parade will be on Saturday at 10am. Route follows Main Street from south to north. Parade route begins at South Street (by High Country Lumber) and ends at the fairgrounds. All vehicle traffic must use detour (usually it starts at 9:30 am). *Note: do not place chairs on sidewalks to save spaces prior to parade. They block access for pedestrians, wheelchairs and strollers. You may bring a chair with you on Saturday morning to watch the parade.


